



Guidelines for Caregivers of an International Student

A caregiver plays a vital role in helping Sacred Heart College International students feel secure and valued while they are living far from their families.

These guidelines outline the key requirements for providing a safe and supportive environment, along with the responsibilities and support available to ensure a positive and successful experience for both Caregivers and the student.

Caregiver Requirements

- Be a New Zealand citizen, permanent resident or have a work or guardianship visa to live in New Zealand, and reside in the Auckland region.
- Be aged 25 years or older and consent to a police vetting process. All individuals aged 18 years or older residing at the same address must also undergo police vetting.
- Understand that approval to act in this role is contingent on the successful completion of all required safety and suitability checks in full compliance with the *Education (Pastoral Care of Tertiary and International Learners) Code of Practice 2021* (the Code) and the Sacred Heart College Guidelines.
- Consent to an initial home assessment completed by a Sacred Heart College Representative.

Caregiver Responsibilities

- Be in contact with the student before their arrival in New Zealand.
- Assist the student in setting up essentials on arrival, including a New Zealand bank account, mobile phone, laptop, HOP card, school uniform and initial shopping needs.
- Maintain regular contact with the student to monitor their wellbeing and engagement in Hostel life.
- Act as the primary point of contact between the student, their family, and the College.
- Liaise with Hostel staff, on all matters concerning the student and support them in setting and enforcing guidelines for behaviour and curfews.
- Take care of the student and provide accommodation in situations where they are unable to remain in the hostel.
- Encourage the student to understand and comply with both New Zealand laws and Sacred Heart College rules at all times.
